# Несколько слов о «Тестах»

Книга предназначена широкому кругу учащихся – и тем, кто изучает грамматику английского языка, и абитуриентам, готовящимся к вступительному экзамену по английскому языку в вуз.

Пособие состоит из двух частей. Каждый из тестов первой части посвящен отдельной грамматической теме. Темы тестов охватывают весь курс грамматики английского языка, который преподается в школе и включен в экзаменационные билеты при поступлении в вуз.

Преподаватель может по своему усмотрению строить работу с тестами. Можно предложить учащемуся выполнить лишь часть теста, если материал еще не пройден в полном объеме (например, в тесте 11 FUTURE ACTIONS могут быть опущены случаи употребления *Present Simple* для выражения действий в будущем, а отработана только тема *will / be going to*). Некоторые тесты могут быть предложены в самом начале работы над темой (например, тест 17 PAST CONTINUOUS не представляет трудностей с точки зрения случаев употребления прошедшего продолженного времени, а охватывает все 'трудные' случаи написания глагола в форме *Participle I*).

Во второй части книги предложены образцы заданий со вступительных вузовских экзаменов. Как правило, вступительный экзамен в гуманитарные университеты и колледжи проводится в два этапа – письменный и устный. Данные тесты представляют собой варианты заданий на письменном экзамене. Тесты 62-64 SAMPLE TEXTS являются типичными заданиями на открывание скобок; тесты 65-68 SAMPLE TESTS – образцы лексико-грамматических заданий; тесты 69-70 – задания по переводу предложений с русского языка на английский.

Начиная работу над тестами 62-64, следует вдумчиво прочитать весь текст, а затем приступить к выполнению задания, в котором необходимо открыть скобки, поставив глагол в нужную форму. Кроме этого

на экзамене предлагается выполнить ещё одно задание по тексту – это либо задание на проверку правильности понимания прочитанного, либо задание написать вопросы к тексту. Следует задавать вопросы разных типов – общий, специальный, разделительный, альтернативный и вопрос к подлежащему.

Проделав тесты 65-68, необходимо проверить работу ещё раз, так как при выполнении таких заданий ошибки часто допускаются из-за невнимательности. При проверке нужно аргументировать себе, почему ответ верен, к какой грамматической теме относится предложение, какие трудности Вам встречались при изучении этой темы. Возможен лишь один вариант ответа из четырех предложенных.

Наиболее типичным последним заданием на письменном экзамене является перевод предложений с русского языка на английский.

Необходимо помнить, что на экзамене отводится ограниченное время на выполнение заданий билета, поэтому целесообразно ограничить время и при выполнении тестов.

Все тесты снабжены ответами. Это дает возможность проконтролировать правильность выполнения заданий и обратить внимание на пробелы в знании грамматики. Мы надеемся, что книга поможет Вам в постижении грамматических трудностей английского языка и позволит успешно подготовиться к вступительному экзамену в вуз.

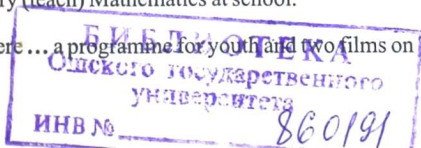

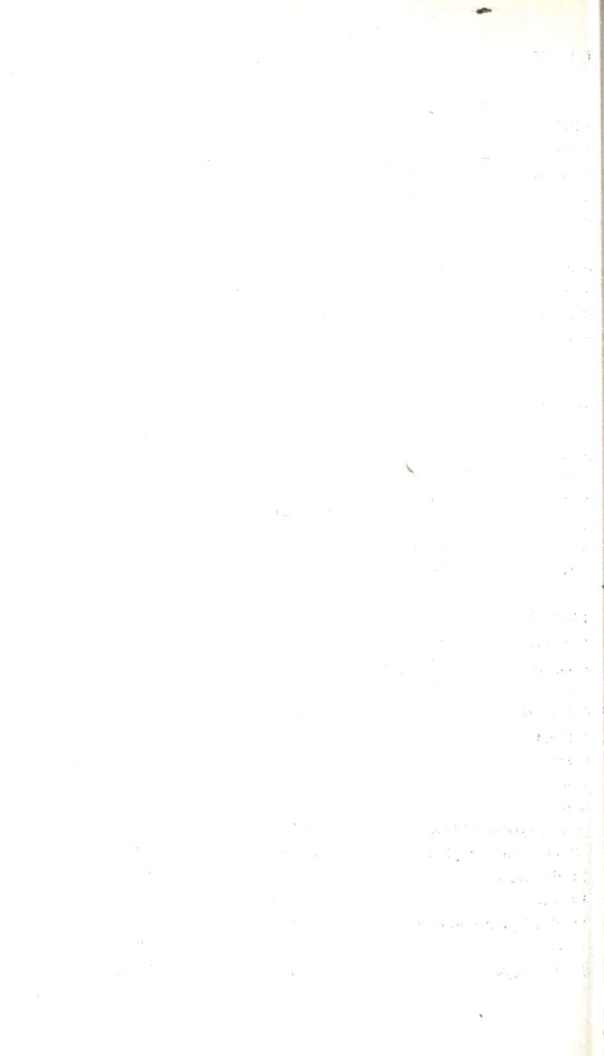
